1. Jer. 23:5, 6 2nd and

- 5 ¶ Behold, the days come, saith the LORD, that I will raise unto David a righteous Branch, and a King shall reign and prosper, and shall execute judgment and justice in the earth.
6 ... and this *is* his name whereby he shall be called, THE LORD OUR RIGHTEOUSNESS.

2. Deut. 5:1–3, 5–8 saying (to 1st), 11 (to :), 12 (to), 16 (to ;), 17–21 (to 1st), 21 4th or, 22, 31–33 I

- 1 And Moses called all Israel, and said unto them, Hear, O Israel, the statutes and judgments which I speak in your ears this day, that ye may learn them, and keep, and do them.
2 The LORD our God made a covenant with us in Horeb.
3 The LORD made not this covenant with our fathers, but with us, *even us*, who *are* all of us here alive this day.
5 ... saying,
6 ¶ I *am* the LORD thy God, which brought thee out of the land of Egypt, from the house of bondage.
7 Thou shalt have none other gods before me.
8 Thou shalt not make thee *any* graven image, ...
11 Thou shalt not take the name of the LORD thy God in vain: ...
12 Keep the sabbath day to sanctify it, ...
16 ¶ Honour thy father and thy mother, as the LORD thy God hath commanded thee; ...

22 ¶ These words the LORD spake unto all your assembly in the mount out of the midst of the fire, of the cloud, and of the thick darkness, with a great voice: and he added no more. And he wrote them in two tables of stone, and delivered them unto me.
31 ... I will speak unto thee all the commandments, and the statutes, and the judgments, which thou shalt teach them, that they may do *them* in the land which I give them to possess it.

4. Zech. 8:7, 8

- 7 Thus saith the LORD of hosts; Behold, I will save my people from the east country, and from the west country;
- 8 And I will bring them, and they shall dwell in the midst of Jerusalem: and they shall be my people, and I will be their God, in truth and in righteousness.

5. Luke 6:12, 13, 20–23, 47–49

- 12 And it came to pass in those days, that he went out into a mountain to pray, and continued all night in prayer to God.
- 13 ¶ And when it was day, he called *unto him* his disciples: and of them he chose twelve, whom also he named apostles;
- 20 ¶ And he lifted up his eyes on his disciples, and said, Blessed *be ye* poor: for yours is the kingdom of God.
- 21 Blessed *are ye* that hunger now: for ye shall be filled. Blessed *are ye* that weep now: for ye shall laugh.
- 22 Blessed are ye, when men shall hate you, and when they shall separate you *from their company*, and shall reproach *you*, and cast out your name as evil, for the Son of man's sake.
- 23 Rejoice ye in that day, and leap for joy: for, behold, your reward *is* great in heaven: for in the like manner did their fathers unto the prophets.
- 47 Whosoever cometh to me, and heareth my sayings, and doeth them, I will shew you to whom he is like:

6. Luke 18:9–14

- 9 And he spake this parable unto certain which trusted in themselves that they were righteous, and despised others:
- 10 Two men went up into the temple to pray; the one a Pharisee, and the other a publican.
- 11 The Pharisee stood and prayed thus with himself, God, I thank thee, that I am not as other men *are*, extortioners, unjust, adulterers, or even as this publican.
- 12 I fast twice in the week, I give tithes of all that I possess.
- 13 And the publican, standing afar off, would not lift up so much as *his* eyes unto heaven, but smote upon his breast, saying, God be merciful to me a sinner.
- 14 I tell you, this man went down to his house justified *rather* than the other: for every one that exalteth himself shall be abased; and he that humbleth himself shall be exalted.

7. Ps. 31:1, 2, 5

- 1 In thee, O LORD, do I put my trust; let me never be ashamed: deliver me in thy righteousness.
- 2 Bow down thine ear to me; deliver me speedily: be thou my strong rock, for an house of defence to save me.
- 5 Into thine hand I commit my spirit: thou hast redeemed me, O LORD God of truth.

8. I Cor. 3:9, 10 (to 3rd), 11

- 9 For we are labourers together with God: ye are God's husbandry, *ye are* God's building.
- 10 According to the grace of God which is given unto me, as a wise masterbuilder, I have laid the foundation, ...
- 11 For other foundation can no man lay than that is laid, which is Jesus Christ.

9. Matt. 6:33 seek

- 33 ... seek ye first the kingdom of God, and his righteousness; and all these things shall be added unto you.

10. Phil. 1:1, 2, 9–11 I

- 1 Paul and Timotheus, the servants of Jesus Christ, to all the saints in Christ Jesus which are at Philippi, with the bishops and deacons:
- 2 Grace *be* unto you, and peace, from God our Father, and *from* the Lord Jesus Christ.
- 9 ... I pray, that your love may abound yet more and more in knowledge and *in* all judgment;
- 10 That ye may approve things that are excellent; that ye may be sincere and without offence till the day of Christ;
- 11 Being filled with the fruits of righteousness, which are by Jesus Christ, unto the glory and praise of God.

11. Prov. 12:28

- 28 In the way of righteousness *is* life; and *in* the pathway *thereof* *there is* no death.

12. Ps. 23:1–3

- 1 The LORD is my shepherd; I shall not want.
- 2 He maketh me to lie down in green pastures: he leadeth me beside the still waters.
- 3 He restoreth my soul: he leadeth me in the paths of righteousness for his name's sake.

13. Ps. 17:15 I

- 15 ... I will behold thy face in righteousness: I shall be satisfied, when I awake, with thy likeness.

14. Ps. 15:1, 2

- 1 Lord, who shall abide in thy tabernacle? who shall dwell in thy holy hill?
- 2 He that walketh uprightly, and worketh righteousness, and speaketh the truth in his heart.

15. I Tim. 6:11 follow, 12

- 11 ... follow after righteousness, godliness, faith, love, patience, meekness.
- 12 Fight the good fight of faith, lay hold on eternal life, whereunto thou art also called, and hast professed a good profession before many witnesses.

16. I John 4:1, 2, 6–8, 16, 17, 19, 21

- 1 Beloved, believe not every spirit, but try the spirits whether they are of God: because many false prophets are gone out into the world.
- 2 Hereby know ye the Spirit of God: Every spirit that confesseth that Jesus Christ is come in the flesh is of God:
- 6 We are of God: he that knoweth God heareth us; he that is not of God heareth not us. Hereby know we the spirit of truth, and the spirit of error.
- 7 Beloved, let us love one another: for love is of God; and every one that loveth is born of God, and knoweth God.
- 8 He that loveth not knoweth not God; for God is love.
- 16 And we have known and believed the love that God hath to us. God is love; and he that dwelleth in love dwelleth in God, and God in him.
- 17 Herein is our love made perfect, that we may have boldness in the day of judgment: because as he is, so are we in this world.
- 19 We love him, because he first loved us.
- 21 And this commandment have we from him, That he who loveth God love his brother also.

17. II Tim. 4:8

- 8 Henceforth there is laid up for me a crown of righteousness, which the Lord, the righteous judge, shall give me at that day: and not to me only, but unto all them also that love his appearing.

18. Ps. 85:11–13

- 11 Truth shall spring out of the earth; and righteousness shall look down from heaven.
12 Yea, the LORD shall give *that which is* good; and our land shall yield her increase.
13 Righteousness shall go before him; and shall set *us* in the way of his steps.

19. Rev. 15:3 Great (to ;)

- 3 ... Great and marvellous *are* thy works, Lord God Almighty; ...

1. SH 323:6

- 6 Through the wholesome chastisements of Love, we
are helped onward in the march towards righteousness,
peace, and purity, which are the landmarks
9 of Science. Beholding the infinite tasks of
truth, we pause, — wait on God. Then we push onward,
until boundless thought walks enraptured, and concep-
12 tion unconfined is winged to reach the divine glory.

2. SH 241:23–24

- One's aim, a point beyond faith, should be to find the
24 footsteps of Truth, the way to health and holiness.

3. SH 2:4 Yes

- Yes,
the desire which goes forth hungering after righteous-
6 ness is blessed of our Father, and it does not return
unto us void.

4. SH 203:3

- 3 In the Science of Christianity, Mind
— omnipotence — has all-power, assigns sure
rewards to righteousness, and shows that matter can
6 neither heal nor make sick, create nor destroy.

5. SH 291:12

- 12 Universal salvation rests on progression and probation,
and is unattainable without them. Heaven is not a local-
ity, but a divine state of Mind in which all the
15 manifestations of Mind are harmonious and

immortal, because sin is not there and man is found having no righteousness of his own, but in possession of “the mind of the Lord,” as the Scripture says.

6. SH 242:15 In, 26–32

In patient obedience to a patient God, let us labor to dissolve with the universal solvent of Love the adamant of error, — self-will, self-justification, and self-love, — which wars against spirituality and is the law of sin and death.

Mere speculation or superstition appropriates no part of the divine vesture, while inspiration restores every part of the Christly garment of righteousness.

The finger-posts of divine Science show the way our Master trod, and require of Christians the proof which he gave, instead of mere profession.

7. SH x:22–23

The divine Principle of healing is proved in the personal experience of any sincere seeker of Truth.

8. SH 365:7, 19

The benign thought of Jesus, finding utterance in such words as “Take no thought for your life,” would heal the sick, and so enable them to rise above the supposed necessity for physical thought-taking and doctoring; but if the unselfish affections be lacking, and common sense and common humanity are disregarded, what mental quality remains, with which to evoke healing from the outstretched arm of righteousness?

If the Scientist has enough Christly affection to win his own pardon, and such commendation as the Magdalen gained from Jesus, then he is Christian enough to practise scientifically and deal with his patients compassionately; and the result will correspond with the spiritual intent.

9. SH 12:10

It is neither Science nor Truth which
acts through blind belief, nor is it the human under-
12 standing of the divine healing Principle as manifested
in Jesus, whose humble prayers were deep and con-
scientious protests of Truth, — of man's likeness to
15 God and of man's unity with Truth and Love.

10. SH 329:5 2nd A, 17

A little under-
6 standing of Christian Science proves the truth of all that
I say of it. Because you cannot walk on the
water and raise the dead, you have no right to
9 question the great might of divine Science in these direc-
tions. Be thankful that Jesus, who was the true demon-
strator of Science, did these things, and left his example for
12 us. In Science we can use only what we understand. We
must prove our faith by demonstration.

To be discouraged, is to resemble a pupil in
18 addition, who attempts to solve a problem of Euclid, and
denies the rule of the problem because he fails in his first
effort.

11. SH 417:10–16

Maintain
the facts of Christian Science, — that Spirit is God, and
12 therefore cannot be sick; that what is termed matter
cannot be sick; that all causation is Mind, acting
through spiritual law. Then hold your ground with
15 the unshaken understanding of Truth and Love, and
you will win.

12. SH 456:22

Truth does
the work, and you must both understand and abide by the
24 divine Principle of your demonstration.

13. SH 495:28

Adhere to the divine Principle of Chris-
tian Science and follow the behests of God,

30 abiding steadfastly in wisdom, Truth, and
Love. In the Science of Mind, you will soon ascertain
1 that error cannot destroy error. You will also learn
that in Science there is no transfer of evil suggestions
3 from one mortal to another, for there is but one Mind,
and this ever-present omnipotent Mind is reflected by
man and governs the entire universe. You will learn
6 that in Christian Science the first duty is to obey
God, to have one Mind, and to love another as
yourself.

14. SH 448:26–30; 449:2

If the student adheres strictly to the teachings of Chris-
27 tian Science and ventures not to break its rules, he can-
not fail of success in healing. It is Christian
Science to do right, and nothing short of right-
30 doing has any claim to the name.

3 leaven causes the whole mass to ferment. A grain of
Christian Science does wonders for mortals, so omnip-
otent is Truth, but more of Christian Science must be
6 gained in order to continue in well doing.

15. SH 253:32–8; 254:10–12

The divine demand, “Be ye therefore perfect,” is sci-
1 entific, and the human footsteps leading to perfection are
indispensable. Individuals are consistent who, watching
3 and praying, can “run, and not be weary; . . .
walk, and not faint,” who gain good rapidly
and hold their position, or attain slowly and
6 yield not to discouragement. God requires perfection,
but not until the battle between Spirit and flesh is fought
and the victory won.
